NAIL NEWS: The two-week manicure
Many nail polish brands promise no-chip manicures, but the reality rarely lives up to the claims. However new Shellac, an in-salon service from Creative Nail Design, delivers. The first hybrid of a gel system and a nail polish, Shellac comes in 12 colours (the range will gradually expand) and is applied like a normal salon manicure, with two minutes curing time under a UV nail lamp per colour coat.

Afterwards, nails are dried completely solid – you can scratch around in your handbag for your keys and suffer no ill effects. The perfectly shiny state of your manicure should last up to 14 days – it grows out rather than chips off.

To remove, you need to re-visit the salon. Nails are simply covered with a special remover wrap and 10 minutes later the colour slides off. You do not need to undergo filing or drilling on the nail, unlike many artificial nail systems which weaken the natural nail.

SAFETY TIP: If you are a nail salon regular and often have your nails cured under a UV lamp, bear in mind that these are similar to sunbeds – always wear a high SPF on your hands.
